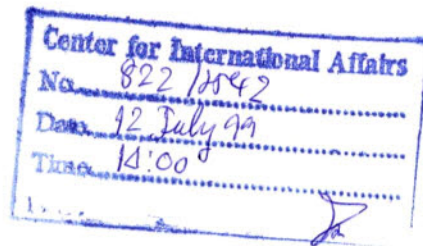

Dr. Singhroy has told me that he would like to work with this group and wishes to have no additional lectures. This is to allow the students time, especially from Week 8 on, to research, work and write the content of the project.

If Dr. Wichit has identified people whom he would like to see included in the Design Project, a key way in which these people could contribute to the project would be to attend the project reviews and provide feedback to the students. We would very much welcome this involvement. The first review, scheduled for August 3, is especially key, as the feedback from these experts would have an impact on the direction and content of the project. If you could please send me the contact information for these persons, I will make sure that they are invited to this System Requirements Review.
