

Vietnam (paper attached):

Very few science faculties before independence

After 1954, education level increased.

1960-90s: concerted government efforts in sending students overseas to study science and establishing research institutes. Effective scientific co-operation with the eastern countries of Europe.

Since 1990 science research & training has declined because of lack of economic resources.

In recent years, government has increased spending in science education.

Co-operation between ASEAN countries is weak because of shortage of infrastructure to support science education.

Internet offered cheap means of learning science and co-operation.

Mathematics is universal and should be chosen as the priority project, followed by the disciplines of Physics, Biology, Chemistry.

Vietnam is preparing to offer mathematical courses and databases of mathematical problems.

Networking is only one of many collaboration models.

Both science and engineering group to be under the common umbrella of the ASEAN Virtual University of Science and Technology (AVUST), which in itself is under the ASEAN University Network (AUN).

Decided in the engineering group meeting to launch only one project, ie. the AVUST.

Objectives of AVEU:

Virtual conferences, seminars & workshop

Joint R&D

Library network

Electronic publication of newsletters and periodicals

Continuing engineering of education for practising engineers

Success criteria:

A network of leading universities in science and technology, IT, and distance education in ASEAN countries.

Tutors training programmes at regional and national levels.

A wider vision to expand the project activities from distance education to other networking. Thawanwong wanted to clarify if the AVSTU would be under AUN, or should it be a separate entity. Posadas replied that AVSTU could be independently run without consulting AUN. However, a coordination model between AVSTU and AUN has to be worked out.

Address from AUAP representative (Umaly):

AUAP has some experience with digital library, distance learning etc.

Adopted problem-based teaching instead of traditional teaching.

Of 200 universities in the region, more than half have a science faculties.

Country Presentation:

Indonesia:

1947: Department of Physics, Biology, Chemistry & Mathematics come together to form a faculty of science.

Science faculties widely spread within Indonesia.

Country report is attached.

Malaysia:

Collaboration needed to ensure growth in the learning of science.

Working together also has the advantage of maximising resources.

Aims to achieve a knowledgeable society, ie. education for all approach.

Science needed to achieve a better quality of life.

SMART schools project:

Ensure students are trained in IT.

Multimedia Supercorridor (MSC)

Global Schools network.

Philippines:

ASEAN member countries can pool their resources, tap into each others competencies and engage in scientific endeavors with greater economies of scale

ASEAN VSU envisioned as a consortium of top universities and institutions, delivering science courses via the distance education mode, utilizing the Internet

VSU a cost-effective means of delivering high quality education to students in the region can address "content deficit" problem being experienced by many universities in the region; can hasten the ability of institutions in the region to bring their academic programs in step with the state of the art in S & T

students desiring to take courses through VSU should have a high level of computer literacy and have appropriate computer with appropriate software; must have access to Internet

VSU web can be used to provide supplementary materials to campus-based students

VSU instructors and content authors have to be trained on on-line courses, web site development, graphic design, video production, etc. and familiarized with copyright and IPR issues

University of the Philippines can participate in proposed VSU

Briefing by Minella:

Gave overall outline of AVSU.

Stressed that for the science group, its members were chosen from the UNESCO regional science networks and its partners, and as such individual country representation has been taken into consideration.

Purpose of meeting to come up with a proposal for AVSU. However, after the Engineers' meeting, the science proposal would be adapted to suit a joint engineering and science proposal.

Address by Aoshima:

June 99, ASEAN foundation identified project. UNESCO submitted 18 project proposals.

Four projects selected.

1st working group meeting for ASEAN Virtual Engineering University (AVEU) convened in Manila in Aug 99.

Formation of IT-based networking among invited participants.

Meeting proposed to also launch the AVSU. Proposal accepted.

In second meeting of the AVEU, it was strongly proposed, and accepted, that the science group be invited to join the engineering group.

Minutes of the ASEAN Virtual Science University (AVSU) (21st - 22nd Jan 00)

21st Jan 00

Present:

Minella

Plus Science Group

9am: Briefing:

Minella briefed the meeting on the background and objectives of the AVSU.

HM sought clarification on the scope and ambitions of this project. Minella replied that this should be determined by the meeting; and presented in the form of a project proposal for the ASEAN Secretariat.

Election of Chairman and rapporteurs

The meeting has elected Dr Hj Abdul Aziz Tajuddin as the chair for the science group. At the same time Amelia and Horn Mun had been elected as rapporteurs.

Establishment of working goal and vision

Each representative provided a short presentation of his/her visions and ideas about the AVSU.

Vietnam:

Virtual co-operation should be combined with 'Real' co-operation workshops, conferences, exchange programmes of scientists, co-advisors of PhD thesis etc.

Establishment of databases to include: library service, courses, examination materials, problems, discussion boards etc.

Concentrate on improving collaboration among ASEAN universities.

Philippines:

Formation of a consortium for: delivery of courses, establishment of centres of excellence & centres of development, possibly as virtual centres.

Indonesia:

Database on research, curriculum development, various information.

Development of virtual activities.

Malaysia:

'Real' university which will confer degrees and relevant certification.

Singapore

Proposed to concentrate efforts on continuing education and provision of education for working adults. Administrative roles should be focused on facilitation (eg. Staff exchange programme, R&D linkup) rather than initiation of programmes, activities etc.

Curriculum development: to focus on online learning for non-traditional students.

Technical: formation of technical support centres for development of interactive materials.

The meeting has reached a consensus to focus the AVSU's effort on education for working adults.

Project proposal discussions

Approach to be taken: Establish minimum technical requirements to participate in this project:

1st level requirement: sufficient basic Internet connections for population.

2nd level requirement: build up of high speed network to fully take advantage of multimedia interactive materials.

Problem analysis & justification.

To properly prepare the ASEAN workforce to function effectively in a knowledge-based economy.
