# **Understanding the Space Environment**

- Space radiation:
  - Protect the crew from radiation while in interplanetary travel, with special attention to shielding from SPEs
  - 2.0 cm of aluminum (equivalent) will limit worst-case SPE dose to < 0.6 Gray, or 6 Sieverts at a quality factor of 10, and which is equal to the lifetime equivalent skin dose for astronauts (section 3.4.2)
  - Repeated encounters with the Van Allen belts (which extend out to about 5 Earth radii) should be avoided if considering High Earth Orbits (HEO's)
- · Space debris:
  - Vehicle structure must be shielded from micrometeorites during the trip from Earth to Mars (section 3.5)
- · Mars surface:
  - Although dust is omnipresent at the surface or Mars, no buildup over time was noted during the combined 3000+ sol mission of the Viking landers (Chapter 4)

# **Understanding the Crew**

- · Cabin Atmosphere:
  - A good compromise between sea-level atmosphere and oxygen enriched low pressure atmospheres might be to use and 81 kPa cabin atmosphere at 17 kPa pO2, the equivalent of Earth normal at 1830 m (table 5-3)
  - The lower cabin pressure will aid in the selection of a pressure for EVAs
  - EVA prebreathing time can be reduced to less than on e hour if EVA suit pressure is 38 kPa and R-1.40 (figure 5-1)
- Crew Operations:
  - Current US flight rules restrict crewmembers from performing EVA's on consecutive days (section 6.2.4)
- · Crew Performance:
  - Crew habitat should separate private, quiet areas from noisy machinery such as exercise, gallery, of waste management
- Crew Psychology:
  - Communication capability is extremely important to crew psychological health - the ability to communication with family is most effective in maintaining psychological well being
