ELCA-SUT-MoE Seminar 'Can learner independence be taught?' Suranaree University 27 March 1999

The following points were adapted from participants' notes:

Teachers' common problems

- · poor student discipline
- large classes difficult to organise
- limited time for learning languages
- learners are often shy
- · lack of good materials
- lack of motivated students
- difficult to hold attention of 50 students
- students don't know how to use dictionaries
- teaching is focused on university entrance exam
- some teachers are not qualified to teach language
- · teachers' workload is too high

Some suggested solutions

- · need for good quality materials
- · need to teach communication, not how to pass exams
- develop students' ability to work in groups
- train group leaders
- establish an English Corner
- establish a self-access centre
- English camps
- · singing contests
- library assignments
- need to give students confidence
- need provocative and stimulating material
- need for simple syllabus
- activities outside class
- vocabulary books

Observations about this seminar

- interesting
- meaningful presentations
- presenters did not have enough time
- some presenters spoke too quickly
- not enough documentation
- topics need to be practical and useful
- good location

Suggestions for the next seminar

- longer than 1 day
- / work on different skills
- / divide seminar by skills: eg Reading, Writing
- need for actual practice during seminar
 - need to locate training in real classrooms
 - seminar program should be ongoing

 - making materials
 - some workshops should be in Thai
 - how to incorporate extracurricular activities
 - more fun approach
 - presenters should speak more slowly
 - practice teaching activities in groups
