Thank you for your fax letter of June 17, 1994, and the feedback you provided regarding the Project Review Committee meeting for 1994, and regarding the SUT personnel who will be visiting Canada during the months of September and October 1994. We shall be pleased to welcome Dr. Roongthan Sujithamrak, Acting Dean of Social Technology, as an additional member of the visiting SUT group. We are pleased that you concur with the general outline of the proposed itineraries for the visitors. With respect to Item 4 of your June 17 fax, I would like to make the following comments:

- 1. Dr. Vutthi's visit to Halifax (Sept. 26 to 30) will include both TUNS and Dalhousie University. I hope you understand that since the University of Toronto is not a member of CUTC, and is not inveed in the project, I suggest that Dr. Vutthi may like to make separate and private arrangements to visit the University of Toronto if he so wishes. I could, however, arrange for a short visit to the Department of Physics at the University of Toronto, while Dr. Vutthi is visiting Ryerson during the week of October 3-7, 1994.
- Since Waterloo is very close to Guelph, it is possible to arrange a one-day side visit to Waterloo so that Dr. Terd and Dr. Suwayd may conduct discussions with the University of Waterloo co-op personnel. 3. FINANCIAL REPORTS

3.1 Partial SUT Expenses in the Implementation of the International Undergraduate Program.

A summary of some of the expenses incurred by SUT in the implementation of the International Undergraduate Program is given in Table 3.

SUT has spent at least Baht 803,633 (C\$43,440) in the promotion of IUP. This is equivalent to Baht 19,600 per applicant or Baht 66,969 per enrollee.

The need for better planning of the promotion is very obvious. The newspaper advertisements were very expensive and were not effective at all. The TV press conference must be continued. However, there is no substitute to personal contact with High School principals.
