And then, after some reflection, I decided that there are two issues which exist and are affecting the ISU, one serious and the other, an inconvenience.

The first issue which ISU is facing and which the Rector and the committee chairpersons should be aware of is the physical health situation of the ISU SSP'99 participants. To date, there have been many trips to the hospital by the ISU van and the SUT ambulance taking SSP participants for a number of different viral and bacterial ailments. Some of our people have had to spend 5 to 7 days in bed, feeling very weak and sick. Others have not been hit so hard. We are interested in establishing contact with the Khorat hospital doctors who have treated our people to better understand what sicknesses we are getting. Any assistance SUT personnel can provide would be greatly appreciated.

The second issue which ISU is confronted with is one which will have as great an affect psychologically as physically. I'm referring to the scheduled closing of the SUT Sports and Recreation Center for one month starting next week. Many of the SSP participants are taking advantage of this wonderful facility, including my wife and me who go almost everyday (we missed a couple of days when we were sick last week). Use of this facility, although not a critical element in the success of the SSP, has always been included. I, personally, have counted on this facility to help me maintain my physical fitness, but also to dissipate the large amount of stress which accumulates each day during the running of the SSP.
