TECHNOLOGY STUDIES

1. RATIONALE

Aviation and space technologies have made possible during the last decades of the 20th century globalization through improved air transportation and telecommunications. Their impacts will even be more during the next century as humankind has just started exploring the potentials of space studies and technologies.

Space programs capture the human imagination and provide unequaled outlet for the human spirit of adventure and creativity. The first human landing on the moon is the greatest adventure of the 20th century. There is forever the quest for finding possible life in outer space and thus understanding better the evolution of life on our own planet. At present, the application of space programs in telecommunications and remote sensing have contributed immensely to human development and knowing our planet Earth. The links of space science to almost all aspects of human studies from pure science (astronomy, physics and biology), social sciences (economics and politics), and even philosophy and the humanities (communication and literature) are just a few benefits of present-day space studies.

There will therefore be a need for an interdisciplinary, multidisciplinary as well as multicultural team of individuals that can respond to the current and future requirements of humankind in the space sector. International cooperation is the only mechanism for developing knowledge, skills and industries to input the technical, economic, social and ethical challenges of a fast changing world.

The International Space University (ISU) which was created in 1987 is one such interdisciplinary, multidisciplinary, international and intercultural institution responding to the above mentioned challenges. 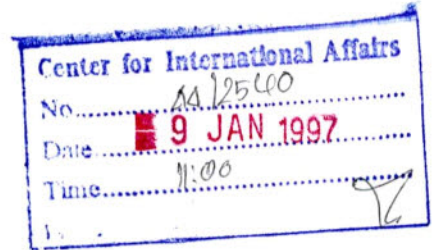

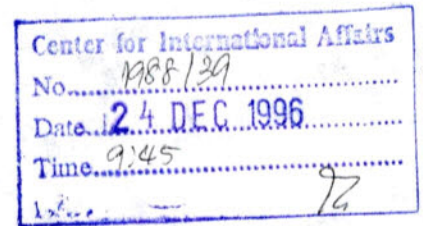
