EARTH University-Salzburg Seminar Series, is preparing to hold a conference in Asia about innovations and potential changes for better education and more responsive professionals for sustainable agriculture all over the world. This seminar series is funded by NORAGRIC, the international aid institution of Norway., and has asked EARTH Univeristy to lead this seminar series.

This is the first time that a seminar series will be held outside of Salzburg after more than 50 years of the founding of this seminar series institution which has been conducting all its seminar series on the theme of reconciliation. It has been key in the debate in such areas as the European Union, the Monetary Integration of Europe, Eastern European reintegration, the German Reunification, etc. Its list of seminar attendees is practically the list of the new leaders at the helm of Europe in both the

government and the private sector.

This time it is leading a new phase into reconciliation and reformation and is starting in education for sustainable agriculture, a topic that is a reconciliation with nature and the environment, and also with reformation of the perceptions, the systems and the methodologies. There will be a conference in Chiangmai for Asia and in Makerere for Africa. The Chiangmai conference will be in October, 2002 but we wish to prepare early. After that there will be another one in Europe and this may kick off a series all over!

This is where we need some assistance. We hope you can give us suggestions on possible participants from the private sector especially the leaders in medium and small-scale agri-businesses who are interested in a reform towards having professionals for sustainable agriculture, entrepreneurial agriculture, and more socially-attuned systems. Our interest is to let them ventilate their views during this conference. For the public sector, Ruben Villareal and Ruben Umaly have given us plenty of suggestions, but both recognize that you are there for the private sector. We discussed this during the preparatory meeting where we met in Chiangmai last week. Candidates from the Indian Subcontinent (India, Nepal, Sri-Lanka, Bangladesh) are most sought because SEAsia is well represented. Nevertheless SEAsia candidates are all welcome.
