The school year at SUT consists of three 14-week terms or Trimester. The first trimester mormally starts in June and the third term ends in late April. Two-weeks recess follows the first and the second terms, while the recess of about five weeks after the third term lasts about five weeks. A student proceeding to the bachelosis degree in four years (twelve terinester) will normally complete a total of 175 eredits.

applicant officially become a student. It includes the payment of fees and the filing of a study list. Both new and continuing students have to complete the registration by the datelines designated in the University calendar. A package of registration can be obtained at the Registrar Office.

Class Enrollment

The schedules of classes list all courses offered for that trimester, the credit values, instructors, hours and locations. In order to complete the enrollment and exceive credits for the work of a term, students have to file a study list by the dateline indicated in the calendar. The program of study has to be approved by the adviser and the university.

Each term a student must take a minimum of 9 eredits and a maximum of 20 credits. Permission to take less than 9 eredit hours or a course in excess of the normal load may be obtained in exceptional circumstances with the approval of the dean.

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Adding, Dropping and withdrawal

A student who wishes to change program of studies by adding, dropping or withdrawal a course should apply to the registration office during the time period specified in the calendar.

Please Note: This document reflects "estimated" costs for an "average" international student. Many students incur higher expenses; some may incur slightly lower expenses. Costs are subject to change without notice.

Explanation of Estimated Cost of Attendance

Tuition and Fees. Actual tuition and fee costs may vary depending upon the number and type of courses a student takes each term. Summer School tuition and fee charges are not included in the estimate. Students who enroll for a half-time course of study (6 credit hours) during the summer will incur about US\$ 1,496.00 in additional expenses for tuition and fees.

Books and Supplies. Estimates offered may be somewhat low for students in the sciences and technology. Estimates do not include books and supplies for students who wish to study during Summer School. A full courseload during summer will require approximately US\$ 275.00 for books and supplies.

Housing. Estimates are for an "average" student living in an apartment with one roommate sharing expenses. Utilities (electricity, water and gas) are included in the estimates.

Telephone. Estimates include few long distance telephone calls. Students who make frequent long distance telephone calls will incur additional costs.

Food. Students who often eat in restaurants or cafeterias will likely incur costs greater than those provided. Students who prepare most meals in their apartments will likely be able to stay within the costs estimated.

Medical Insurance. The University of Alabama requires that all international students must have continuous medical insurance coverage. The estimate is relatively accurate. The University encourages students with families to obtain medical insurance coverage for all family members. Annual costs for a spouse are about US\$ 1,800.00 to 2,200.00 and costs per child are about US\$ 500.00 to 600.00.

Transportation. Estimates may be less if a student walks or rides a bicycle. Students who choose to own and operate automobiles will incur significantly increased costs.

Personal Expenses. These expenses vary greatly from student to student.

Please Note:

Students and their financial sponsors should plan to meet the estimated expenses for the duration of the student's studies. U. S. laws and regulations generally prohibit off-campus employment during an international student's first year in the U. S. After the first year it is difficult (and frequently impossible) to find an off-campus job and it is difficult to obtain lawful authorization to take a job if one is found. On-campus job are few in number and difficult to obtain. Students and their financial sponsors should <u>not</u> plan to meet an costs through on-campus or off-campus employment.

All estimates on this document are in United States currency (US\$) and have been rounded off to the nearest \$5.00.

All estimates are subject to change without notice. This document reflects estimated costs for the 1993-94 academic year, which ends in August of 1994.

An accompanying spouse (wife or husband of a student) who is not a student and accompanying children will require additional funds for support. The estimates offered for married students represent the minimum funding which will probably be required.

It is unlikely that an international student would be able to study at The University of Alabama for less than the estimated costs.

Academic expenses incurred by students who elect to take a course during Interim Term (a short term between Spring Semester and Summer School) are not included in the estimates. Tuition and fee charges for an Interim Term course are approximately US\$ 650.00.
