

### RE: POSSIBLE LINKAGE WITH THE PHILIPPINES

I have recently visited Mindanao, Philippines on invitation of Dr. Angel Alcala, the Chairman of the Commission on Higher Eduaction of the Philippines. The latter is the equivalent of the Ministry of University Affairs in Thailand. Dr. Alcala also has a cabinet rank.

They have a number of programs in the Mindanao Advanced Education Project (MAEP) including those in Peace Studies, Languages, Environmetal Biology, Marine Biology, Mathematics and Agriculture. One of the strategies for the human resource development and research components of the project is international networking or linkages. I have been requested to help and immediately my thoghts were or Australia universities.

In this connection, I would be most grateful if you could give me a short list of universities which may be interested to partner with the universities in Mindanao in any of the above mentioned fields (Kindly specify the universities for each field). CHED has some funds for shorlarships but it would be most helpful if assistance through AUSAID could be sought by the Philippine universities in cooperation with their counterpart universities in Australia.



I shall be most greatful for your kind advice and I hope collaboration can be established between some Phillippine and Australian universities. I shall countinue assisting CHED in this project while still working with SUT. This is part of the Thailand-Philippine MOU which was signed by the two Ministers of University Affairs last June.
