RE: POSSIBLE COLLABORATION WITH THAILAND

Prof. Dr. Wichit Srisa-an, Rector of Suranaree University of Technology would like to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 8 April. He has requested me to express his appreciation for your interest in fostering collaboration between SUT and Nova Scotia. It was equally a pleasure and honor for him (and more so for me)to meet your team during your short visit to Thailand.

Since our Institute of Medical Sciences is not yet in operation, we would have to delay discussion in this field. Our present major interest would be in the field of computerized courseware production specially in the fields of science and engineering. A network of Universities in the Asia Pacific involved in Distance and Multimedia Education has been organized in the recent meeting of the Association of Universities of Asia and Pacific in Tokyo, Japan. SUT being the Secretariat of the Association will be incharged of the program. Thus this is one possible area of cooperation with Nova Scotia colleges and universities.

Public-private partnerships specially in food science and their possible participation in a third country project like in Vietnam is of great interest to us as we are trying to establish collaboration with industries and universities in the field of food engineering in collaboration with the Hanoi Agricultural University and the Hanoi University of Technology. I have mentioned this project to Mr. Eagle before and any participation of Universities and private industries from Nova Scotia would be most welcome.

We have received already the brochure from the Nova Scotia Community College and I have passed on the materials to relevant Institutes in the University. I will communicate again to Mr. John Keating as soon as I receive feedback from our Deans.

Dr. Wichit expressed regrets in the delay of his possible trip to Nova Scotia till the time that he will have a chance to visit the United States. At present, his heavy engagements in Thailand in Southeast Asia as well as the opening of the new school

I am writing to thank you for a most productive and informative meeting on March 5, 1997.

During our three days in Thailand, encouraging discussions were held with government and university officials. The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Academic Cooperation between Thailand and the Department of Education and Culture in Nova Scotia has laid the foundation for developing more specific understandings on how a mutually beneficial relationship might develop. In addition, the Presidents of the universities and community college system will be advised of your specific interests and may choose to contact you directly.

I am most interested in identifying areas of mutual interest and developing a memorandum of understanding between your institution and Nova Scotia and specific institutions which would specify areas of joint interest and cooperation. Please advise me as to how we can best work with you toward achieving our mutual academic goals.

I would like also, to officially invite you to tour Nova Scotia's institutions at your convenience. While here, I would be delighted to invite you to experience Nova Scotia hospitality at one of our fine resorts.

Thank you most sincerely for your warm welcome and informative discussions.

Ambassador von Nostitz in the Canadian Embassy has kindly agreed to assist us as we move towards the development of specific agreements.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ON ACADEMIC COOPERATION BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE OF NOVA SCOTIA, CANADA AND THE MINISTRY OF UNIVERSITY AFFAIRS OF THAILAND

The Department of Education and Culture of Nova Scotia, Canada and the Ministry of University Affairs of Thailand (hereinafter referred to as "the Parties"),

Recognising the importance of education and training in national development,

Mindful of each other's achievements in this field,

Desiring to strengthen and broaden cooperation and mutual assistance in the provision of education in their respective countries,

Have reached the following understandings:

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

- This Memorandum of Understanding provides the framework within which detailed proposals for programs of education cooperation in respect of the common activities are to be jointly considered between the two Parties.
- 2. The Parties undertake to encourage:
 - (a) Cooperation in education and training, including the development of institutional links at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, diploma programs, specialized training courses, and the promotion of staff and student exchanges;
 - (b) The exchange of information on education and training systems and curriculum development;
 - (c) Cooperation in developing specific education and training programs and projects between appropriate authorities and institutions;
 - (d) Cooperation in research and development;
 - (e) Interaction between government bodies and officials of educational and training institutions.

FUNDING

 As a general principle, the costs of cooperative activities undertaken pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding will be funded on a mutually agreeable basis.

CONSULTATION

Representatives of the Parties will meet biennially, or as they may otherwise
mutually determine, to review the operation of this Memorandum of
Understanding.

SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

 Any dispute arising from the interpretation or implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding will be resolved by consultation between the Parties.

IMPLEMENTATION

- Each Party will facilitate the arrangement of other activities in its territory not specifically mentioned in this Memorandum which are in accordance with the spirit of this Memorandum.
- 7. The two Parties will convene periodic meetings for the purpose of establishing appropriate measures for developing specific programs and projects between their appropriate authorities and institutions and for reviewing the implementation of this Memorandum.
- This Memorandum will come into effect on signature and will remain in effect until either Party requests its termination on six months prior notice through diplomatic channels.



1. Project Title

"Scientific Visit"

2. Brief Description

The Center for Scientific and Technological Equipment (CSTE) is responsible for the provision of training equipment for study programs and research equipment for the university. Also, it will be involved in the establishment of equipment and relevant services for the SUT technopolis, i.e. research park or science park. Therefore, the CSTE is seeking useful information to support such activities.

3. Rationale

Suranaree University of Technology (SUT) is the first fully autonomous state university of Thailand and the second newest of the state universities of the country. It emerged in July 1990 as the specialized university with Science and Technology as academic areas of emphasis. The university began offering undergraduate instruction with eight degree programs in agriculture and engineering in May 1993 followed by graduate program and international undergraduate programs in 1994. The present student population amounts to 4800 with an enrolment of new students around 1500 each year.

Establishment and management of the undergraduate laboratories is the responsibility of the Center for Scientific and Technological Equipment (CSTE) in collaboration with relevant institutes, i.e. faculties. The university also commits its duty to provide post graduate programs in science and engineering. Thus the other task of the CSTE is to provide common sophisticated equipment for research purposes and the CSTE will have to conduct appropriate instrumental analysis upon requests.

In 1998 a graduate program in nuclear technology will be set up for students in Science and Engineering disciplines. In addition to the main regular courses like Nuclear Reactor Theory, Nuclear Power, Nuclear Instruments and Detection, Radiation Processing, Radiochemistry and Radiation Protection, service courses in Nuclear Power Generation will be given to undergraduate students, in Electrical and Mechanical Engineering. Major equipment for teaching and research will include Electron Beam Irradiator, Neutron Generator and Gamma Irradiator. The School of Nuclear Technology at SUT will be the first of its kind in the northeastern region of the country. It will also serve as a monitoring station for nuclear background radiation and nuclear fallout working closely in corporation with authorized agencies like the Office of Atomic Energy for Peace (OAEP) and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

4. Purpose of the visit.

- 4.1 To acquire information on curriculum in nuclear technology/engineering as well as the exchange of ideas and expertise for establishing research and teaching units.
- 4.2 To have an access to nuclear technology advancement especially in Nuclear Power Development, Radiation Processing with Electron Beam and Gamma Irradiation, Applications of Neutron Generator in Teaching and Research.
- 4.3 A visit to Science or Research Parks in Canada especially the ones relevant to the application in nuclear technology.

5. Visiting time and period.

It is preferable to have the visit taking place in April 1997 with a duration of 2 to 3 weeks.

In case that the BMTA does not agree with your request, you still can start legal proceedings. It means you will have to hire lawyers for this purpose. This will consume a lot of time and money and you will have to bear all costs incurred.

We hope to hear your response as soon as possible.
