> Dear Michael,

> I am very pleased that you will be able to join the Tokyo Conference and
> that Dr. Nakamura has communicated with you.

> I read with great interest the topics that you will present. One of them
> caught my attention—Digital Media Projects.

> I have just finished revising an old textbook in College Genetics which I
> wrote a few years ago. I would like to develop most chapters if not the
> whole book into multimedia modules which can be used by ordinary students
> and also for distance education.

> In this connection, I would like to know if the Digital Media Project is
> the one most applicable to the one I have in mind. As you know, we have the
> SUT-CUTC project which will still be going on till March or 1998. I think
> there is still some money for me to be able to have a short stay at your
> Center to at least develop one module. Is it possible for me to do what I

> have in mind?

Yes. Of course you would be most welcome to come here for this, and yes, the Digital Media Projects Office would be the location here at the Rogers Centre.

>Will this be possible sometime this year?

This would be very possible. A good time to be here is from may through june and again in august, as there are a number of workshops running. July is also a possibility, but there are fewer ongoing workshops to tap into. However, a custom set of training could be put together as well as an assitant to help you learn and develop your module.

>What will be the

> requirements for me to apply for such training? For the finances, I will put
> it under the post-doctoral project between our two universities. This grant
> is usually for one term but I do not think I can be away for that long.
> Perhaps a reasonable period is one month. Do you think this will be enough
> to work on at least one module?

One month would be very compressed, but do-able for a first module. Ideally, you could then get equipped back home to continue development. A six-week schedule would be a little less hectic, but you know your own pace and preferences. One thing you might ask for would be funding for a student assistant. We could perhaps find someone who could help you develop your module while you are here from our upper year students or a recent graduate. Just a thought...

> Depending upon your advice, I will write the appropriate proposal and
> request to Sam Michael or Stalin Boctor for such a grant. The meeting of the
> Board will be the first week of April. Thus, may I kindly request for an

> early reply. I would appreciate highly any advice that you may give.

I hope you are able to come here for this project. If approved, there are a number of things that you could do in advance to prepare, and we can provide you with tutorials and tips on preparing some materials before you arrive to make the most of your visit.

I hope this helps. If you have other questions, please feel free to send them, and I will do my best to respond quickly.

Greetings and Best Wishes for 1997



The AUAP Secretariat is a little bit disappointed from the response to the Colloquium. We sent at the same time the notices for two Colloquia which AUAP is organising... one for Engineering in February and the other on Globalization and Distance Education in Tokyo in April. To our surprise, the response to the meeting in Tokyo was more. We already have already received about 90 reservations for Tokyo and about 25 -30 only for Engineering. The participants for the Engineering will be mostly from the Greater Mekong Region- ie. Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, Myanmar and Thailand. There are a few from the Philippines and Indonesia. In a way, it is also good as the discussion could be more at personal level and intensive. I hope this will still be okay for the group. The participation of the Industry is again very minimal. We are still hoping some more participants would come.

Incidentally, the co-organizer in Tokyo has agreed to cover the accommodation cost for Dr. Murphy, the Director of Rogers Communication Center, if he could give a paper. I have informed him of this news and am presently waiting for his reply.

RE: TOKYO CONFERENCE, APRIL


