Dear DR. MICHEL KHALIL,

Thank you for your email of 28 January. After returning from Hanoi we had a Steering Committee Meeting for the UNESCO Regional Conference on Higher Education which will be held in July in Tokyo at the UN University. AUAP is one of the co-organizers and so Dr. Wichit and I had to participate. Also I was responsible for the three major paper writers - Dr. Angara of the Philippines, Dr. Harman of Australia and Dr. Ping of Ohio. Dr. Angara and Dr. Harman participated and I had to take care of them.

On the 29th I left for Manila with the former Minister of University Affairs of Thailand to visit some universities. Thus, it was only today that I returned to SUT. While in Manila, the Minister was awarded an honorary degree by the Technological University of the Philippines. It was a hectic 4-day visit. Dr. Alcala was the host. Thus, I had time to discuss again with him the interest of Quebec and the University of Quebec in collaborating with the Philippines in the field of Marine Resources Management specially in the Visayas and Mindanao. This will be most relevant as there is the EAGA grouping (Indonesia, Malaysia, Brunei and the Philippines) of economic zone It includes collaboration of at least five universities and he is proposing Marine Resources Management as one of the areas of cooperation among these regional universities and also within the universities in the Visayas and Mindanao (Philippines.). Thus, it is a potential area of collaboration.

Dr. Saguiguit of SEAMEO SEARCA reconfirmed his interest in facilitating possible meeting with the prawn growers association of Negros in the Visayas. He could help us in the project.

It is a pity that I was not able to get in touch with Dr. Le Goff during his visit to Vietnam. It is possible we were there at the same time (13-23 January). I was able to visit Haiphong for the week end and I like the place. Some parts are so beautiful like the opera house and the huge park. It is also so close to Do Son Beach. Perhaps linkage with the University there on marine resources management also be studied. I would be willing to help in anyway I can.
