In response to Dr. Matias, at Chulalongkorn University, we are similar to University of the Philippines as Dean Atanacio explained in his email. Most of the courses, which utilizing the Internet as the media, are mainly to delivery course materials, assignments, discussions, etc. to the students. The attached powerpoint file include link to some of those courses.

And we have plane to develop some continuing education courses for long distance learning. These courses include Basic Machining, Advanced Machining, Basic Automotive, Advanced Automotive, Advanced Construction and Capentery. These courses are submitted to the Department of Human Development for budget grant. We are waiting for the result.

>In response to Dr. Matias' query on whether the UP College of
>Engineering has online courses, there are courses that are offered with
>online support in terms of course materials, assignments, discussions,
>etc., but these are still managed predominantly using classroom
>interaction. There is no completely online course offered in the
>College. The University of the Philippines has an Open University that
>has the responsibility for distance education, but it does not yet have
>any degree program for engineering. If the College of Engineering will
>go into online engineering courses or programs, it will probably work
>with the UP Open University in the development of the materials.

>
>For a trial run on academic program courses, I suggest we look at the
>possibility of developing Dr. George Bereznoi's nuclear engineering
>course into an online course. He has been offering this in Chulalongkorn
>University for quite sometime and this semester is offering it in the
>University of the Philippines. If the course can be developed, probably
>with the help of AECL, then we can do a test run of an academic course,
>together with what we plan to offer in the continuing engineering
>education area.
