Dear Pin:

I just got your fax. It looks good. I'll try to give you what you want and answer your questions right here...

1. It is OK that everybody will get to speak for only 5 minutes. That could be no problem.
2. As for which ISU founder will be there, that is still a question here in Strasbourg. I am thinking that, because of the long distance either of the two founders would have to travel and since they would only be there for a few days, it may not be feasible for them to come. It may be that they send a video address to be shown at the appropriate time. What do you think?
3. I will check on the status of US Congressman Mr. George Brown. I am not sure whether he's actually committed or not. I just had a chat with a colleague and she suggested that perhaps we should try to get a dignitary from the United Nations to attend this ceremony. This could be a replacement for Mr. Brown if he can't come. I'll ask Gretchen what she thinks when she gets back into the office (she had to take the latest version of the Program Handbook to the printers).
4. With respect to the agenda for the OC, it looks good but I have some questions.
  - a. When will the students do the flag procession? If it is before the princess gets there, then maybe we can put the flagpoles behind the stage instead of at the sides of the room.
  - b. Will there be no ISU "Master of Ceremonies"? Originally, the concept was for the SSP program director (Dave Kendall) would introduce ISU President and ISU Founder and Thai Minister. The Thai Minister would then introduce the Princess. Is this not how it will work? This may be a detail

5. The speech by the Princess can be as long as she wants it, but if we have to put a time down on the agenda, 30 minutes is fine. If she wants to speak for a shorter period of time than 30 minutes, that's OK too!

With respect to paying for non-local lecturers (visiting lecturers NOT from the Korat area, including AUAP), ISU will OF COURSE! pay for their transport and lodging at Surasummanakhan!

The biggest point is that ISU won't pay fees, but transport, lodging and food are no problem...

Dear Pin:

I wanted to take this email just to tell you what a great job you're doing for us... you are the best spokesperson SUT could have chosen to work with ISU!

I especially am delighted about your news about the welcome bags (do you know what they'll look like?) and the pottery village trinkets... the students will feel soooooo special!

I will update the Opening Ceremony diagram to reflect the SUT/ISU VIPs in the front rows and the ISU students next. The back rows for ISU students will be omitted.

I'm probably forgetting other things for which I am very grateful, but suffice it to say that I am really looking forward to this SSP and you are one of the biggest reasons for it!

I have some good news... do you want to hear it?

I hope you said yes, because here it is...

Ruben said that he has the following people who want to apply to ISU SSP'99: 2 (was 3, but one dropped out) teaching faculty, 2 non-teaching faculty, and then a lot of SUT students. His priority was the 2 teaching faculty, then the 2 non-teaching faculty, then the SUT students.

What if I told you that I'm trying to work a deal here so that both teaching faculty, both non-teaching faculty, AND UP TO FOUR!!! of the SUT students could attend the SSP'99?

There would be a few conditions: everybody would have to live at home and not in the Sura II accommodations. Do you think this will be a problem? For the teaching and non-teaching faculty, this shouldn't be a problem.



However, for the students, since they will have graduated from SUT already, it is not clear whether they will be able to live in SUT housing during the SSP.

If they can live in the SUT housing during the summer, we can take 4 students. If they can't (which means that they will live with the rest of the SSP students in Sura II), we can only take 2 students.

I will explain the rationale about this policy if you'd like over a Singha or Elephant beer! Basically, though, the total amount of deferred tuition can add up to \$26,000 (4, one-quarter scholarships for the faculty and either 2, one-half scholarships or 4, one-quarter scholarships for the students).

Don't tell Ruben about this yet... I just wanted to get your impressions about how he'd react. Do you think he'd like this compromise? I really want to get more of the SUT students (not just faculty) involved with the SSP... what do you think?

I'll stop writing now... I wanted this email to be just for thanking you, but I've already added work, too! I'm very sorry!

Thanks for everything, and tell Eckert that you deserve at least one glass of wine for the great job you're doing!
